





# MLK: Letter from Birmingham Jail

- Dr. Martin Luther King Jr. was jailed in Birmingham, Alabama for peacefully protesting for civil rights.
- Clergymen (men of the church) from Alabama criticized King's methods of protesting (peacefully)
- They did agree that racial injustices exist.
- King suffered through harsh conditions in the Birmingham jail.
- He wrote the letter to defend his non-violent protests.




