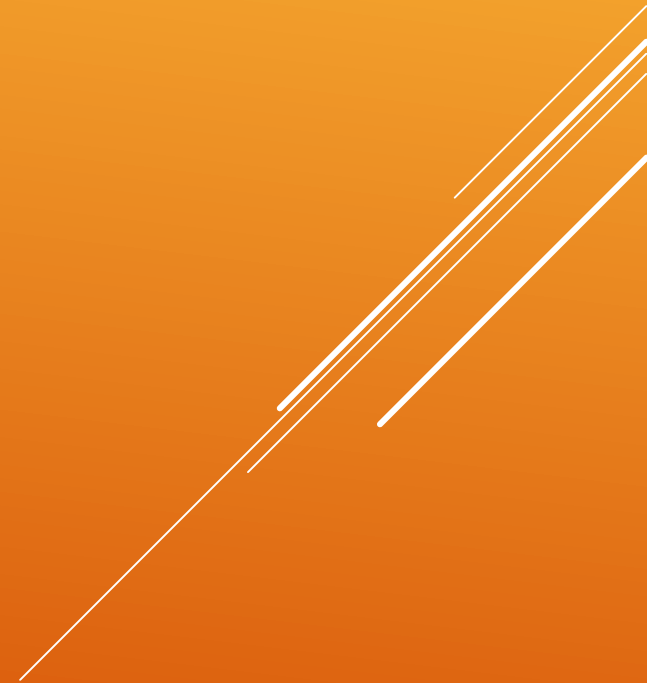

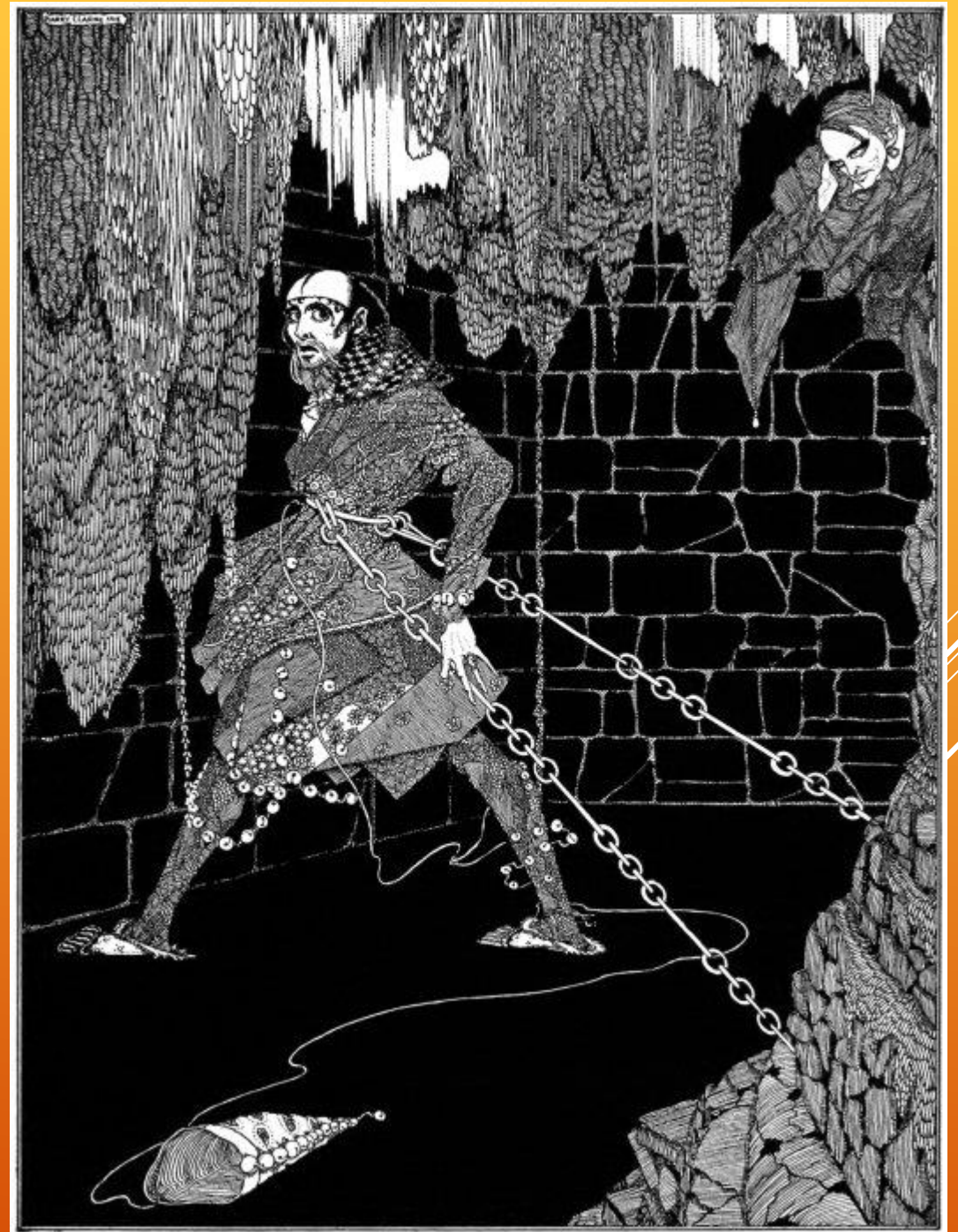

EDGAR ALLEN POE

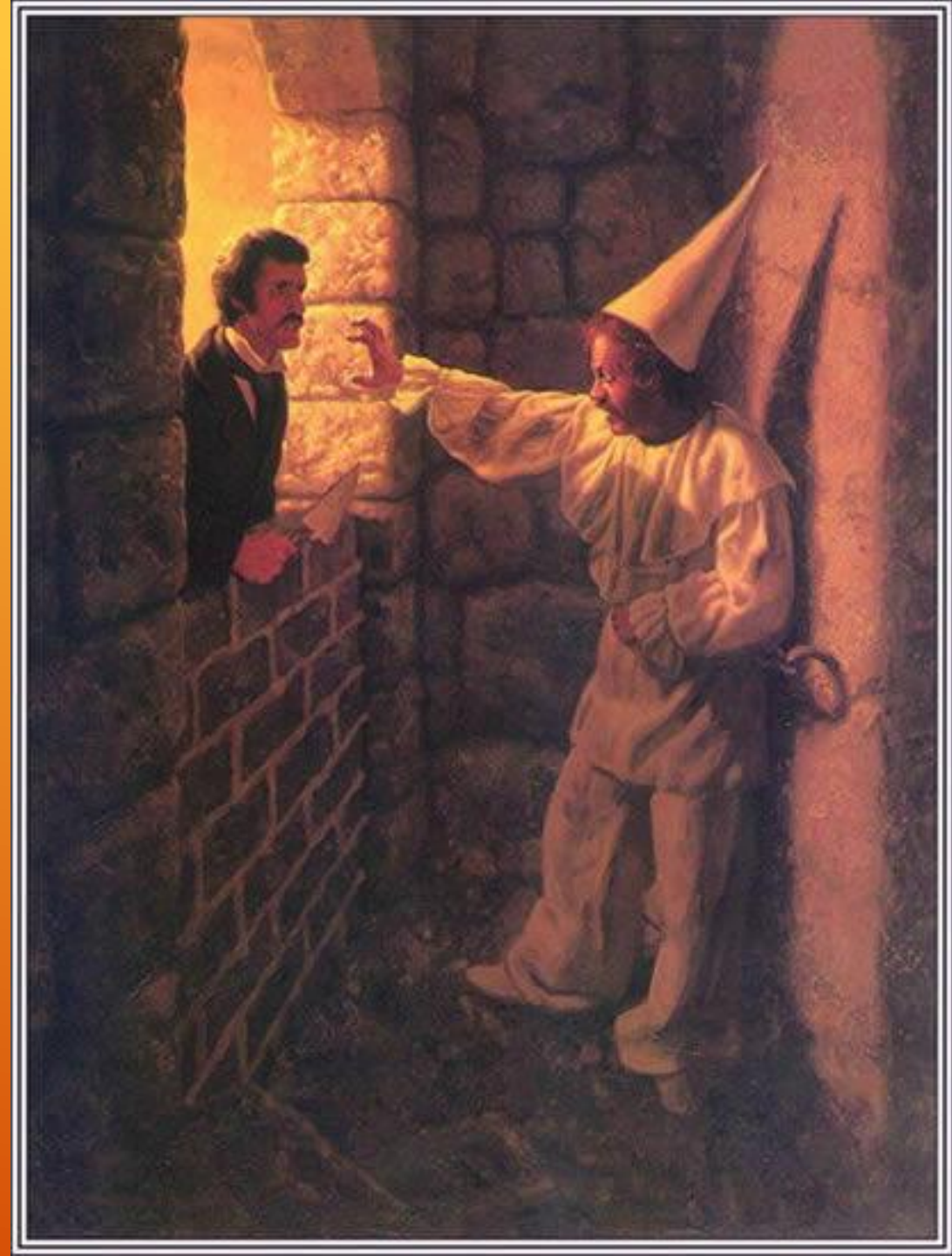
- ▶ A story of revenge...and **MURDER!**
- ▶ Cask = barrel
- ▶ Amontillado = wine
- ▶ Translation = “The Barrel of Wine”

“THE CASK OF AMONTILLADO”



- ▶ Our narrator is *Montresor*, who comes from a wealthy family.
- ▶ His friend is *Fortunado*.
- ▶ Fortunado's name means "fortunate one" (lucky one)

"THE CASK OF AMONTILLADO"



- ▶ **DEFINITION:** When the reader or audience knows more about the circumstances or future events than the actual characters in the scene.
- ▶ **EX)** *In a scary movie, the character goes into a house they think is empty, but the audience knows the killer is in the house. This increases the suspense.*

DRAMATIC IRONY EXAMPLE

- ▶ **DEFINITION:** When a speaker or narrator says one thing while meaning the opposite.
- ▶ **EX)** *Saying "Oh, fantastic!" when the situation is actually very poor*

VERBAL IRONY



Verbal irony is when a speaker says one thing but means another.

SURE, I'D LOVE to go CRAWL inside that ROTTING goat carcass and find your missing wallet.



In this example, he's not particularly keen on crawling inside the dead goat.

According to some literary experts, sarcasm is a form of verbal irony. According to others, it's not. The definition and usage of verbal irony is not important to remember; what *is* important to remember is that while these people are arguing back and forth about it, the rest of us are doing more interesting things like eating fried foods, stargazing, and riding jet-skis.
