Claim

- OThe MAIN argument or position an author takes on a particular issue/topic.
- OEX) Turtles are dying at alarming rates due to pollution rather than natural causes.
- OEX) Self driving cars are more dangerous than useful for society.



Reasons

- OWHY the author has their stance on this particular issue.
- OServes as a basis for the argument.
- OEX) Turtles are dying at alarming rates from plastic waste.
- OEX) Self-driving cars are dangerous because they can be hacked.



Evidence

- OFacts, statistics, or information used by the author to back up each premise an author uses to back up his or her claim.
- OEX) 1/3 turtles die directly from choking on plastic waste in the ocean.
- OEX) 30 Tesla self-driving cars have crashed in the past year to date.



Counterclaim

- OAn opposing claim the author uses to show the opposite side of the argument
- OThe author then debunks/refutes this claim
- OEX) <u>Some scientists have argued that a toxic green algae is to</u> <u>blame in the sudden deaths of sea turtles</u>. **However**, this algae only accounted for 60 turtle deaths last year, out of 3,000.
- OEX) Some people argue that self-driving cars are more safe due to lack of human error. **However**, self-driving cars are more likely to be hacked or have software malfunctions.




