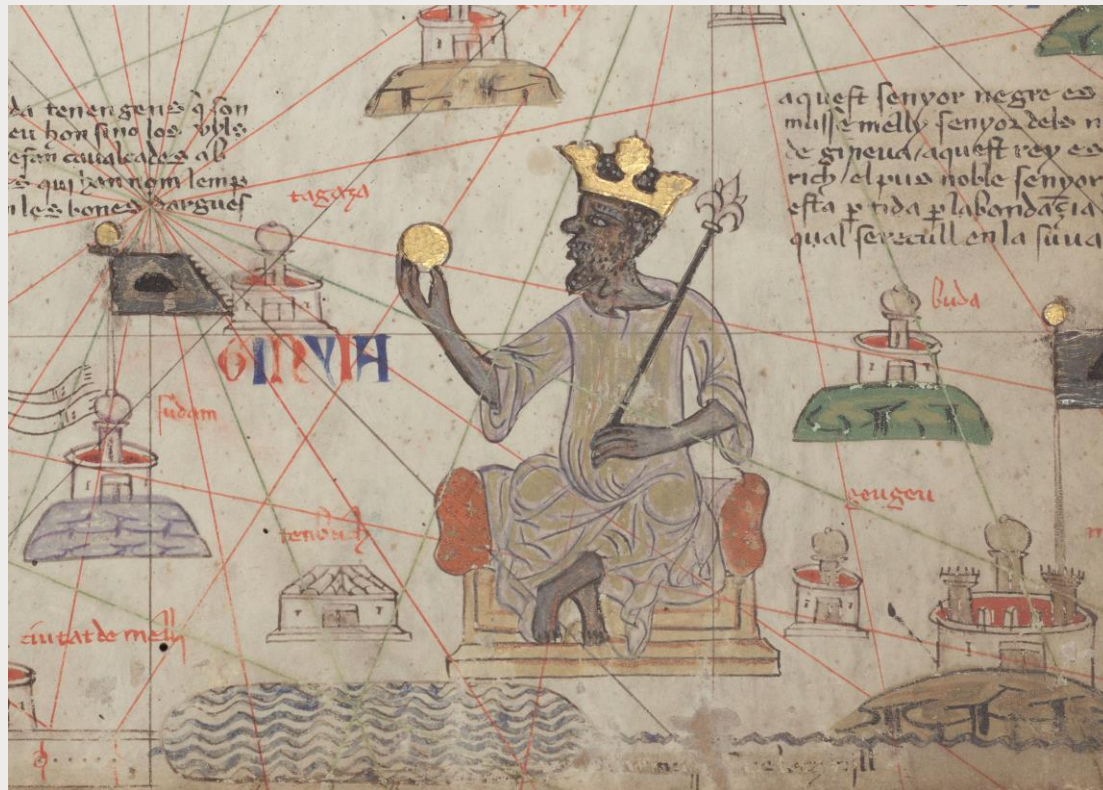


# Black History Month Day 1: Mansa (King) Musa I

- Built advanced universities, libraries, and culture



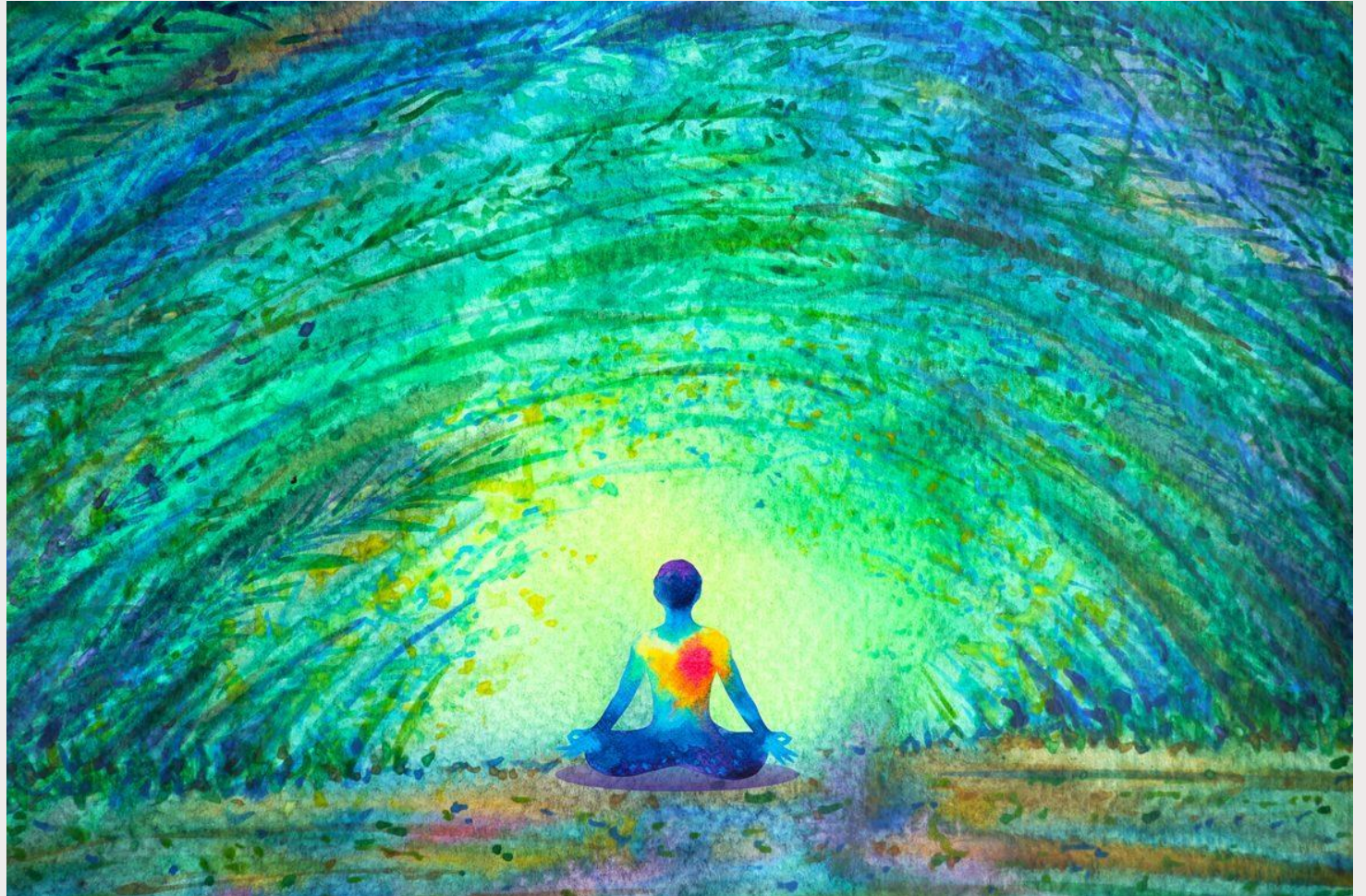

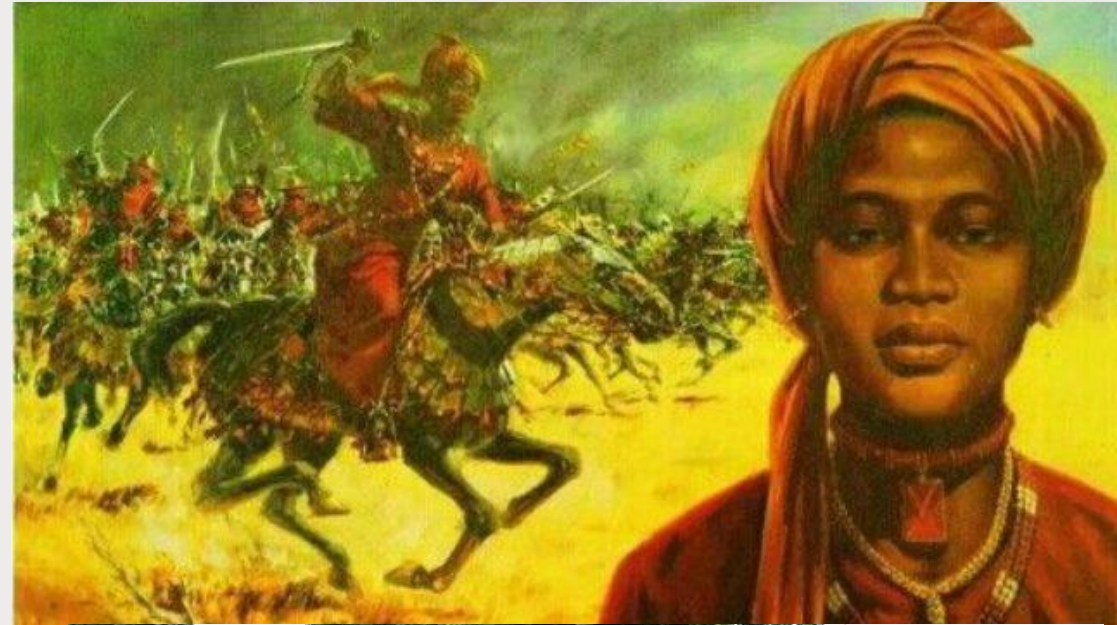




# Black History Month: Day 2

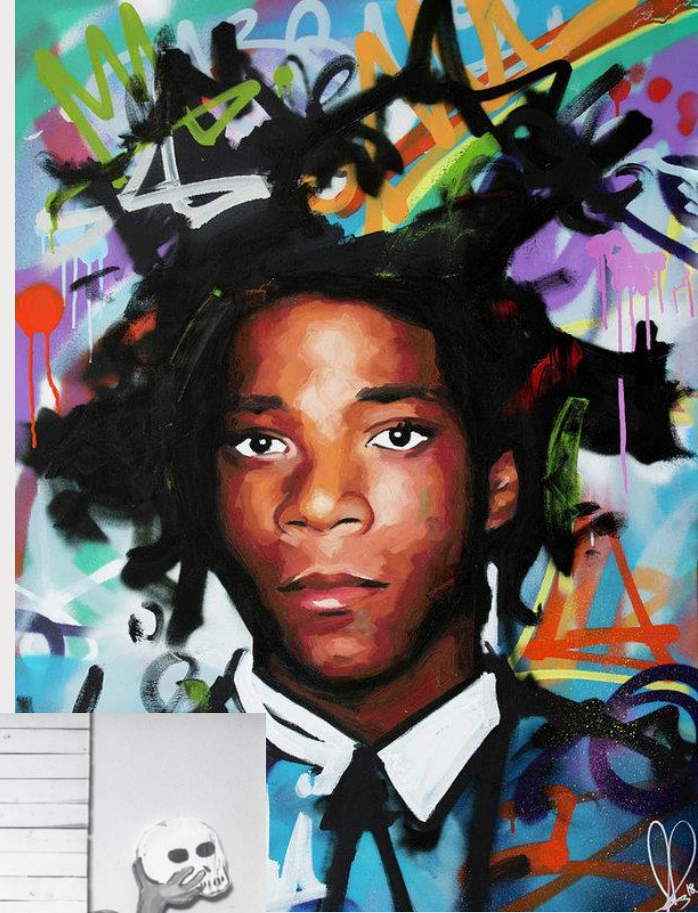


# Black History Month – Day 3: Jean-Michel Basquiat

- American artist of Haitian and Puerto Rican descent from Brooklyn, NY
- Influenced by rap, hip hop, and punk culture of the 1970s & 1980s
- His art was social commentary on poverty, racism, and the inner vs outer experience

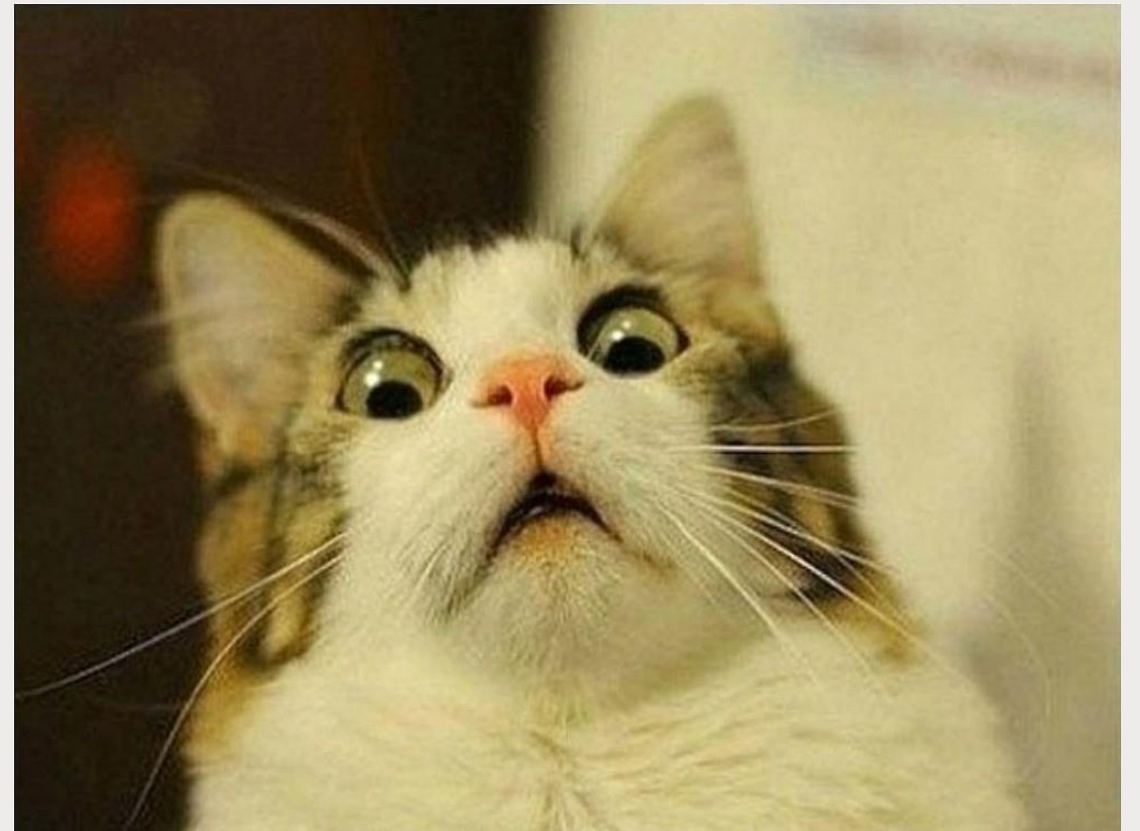

# Black History Month – Day 4: Fannie Lou Hamer

- Civil rights activist 1917-1977
- Co-founder and vice-chair of the Freedom Democratic Party, Student Nonviolent Coordinating Committee (SNCC)
- She was threatened and harassed by white supremacists and police while trying to register to vote and wanted to change this.



# Black History Month – Day 4:

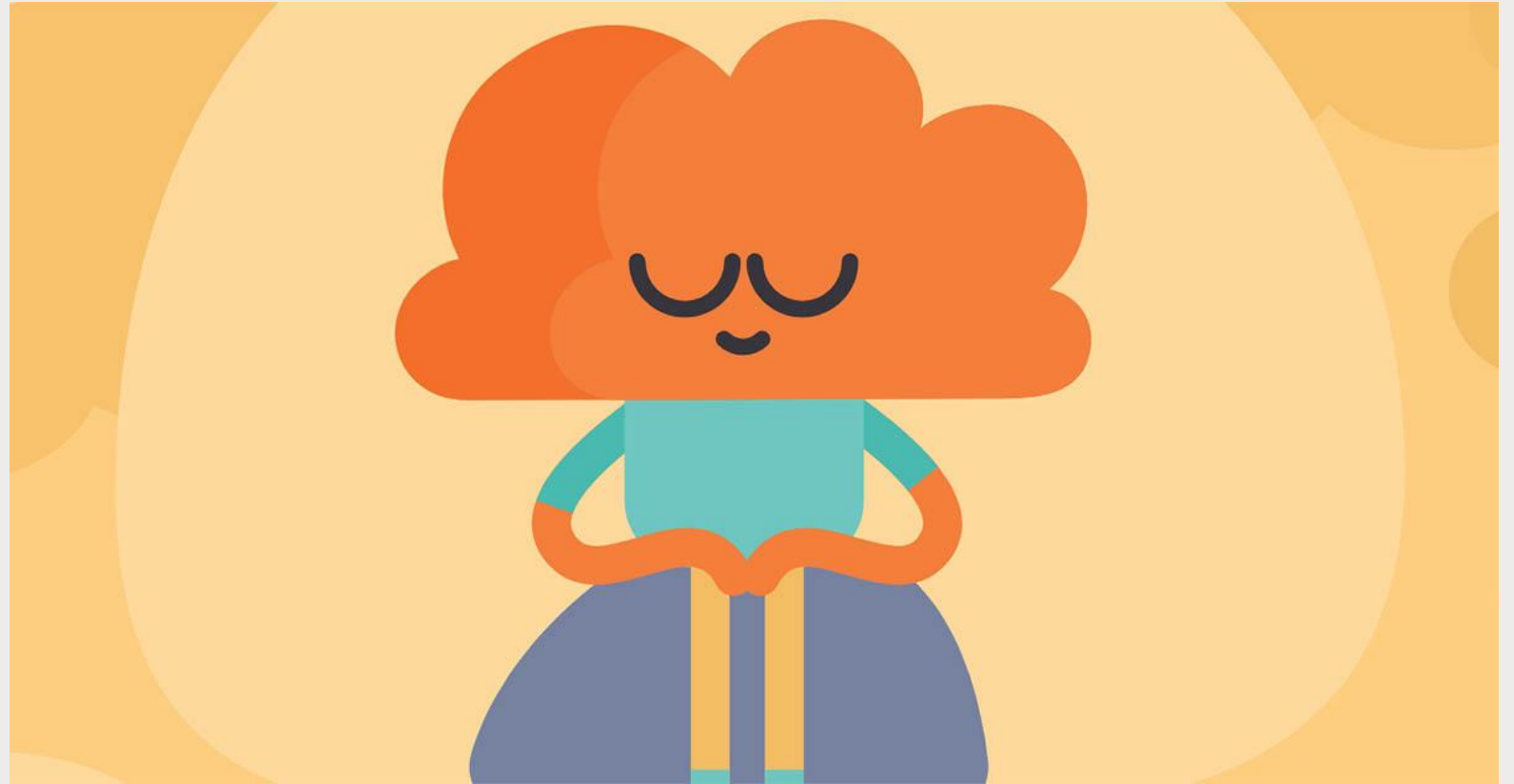
## Fannie Lou Hamer

- Was shot at 16 times in a drive by shooting by white supremacists.
- Fought to get other African Americans the right to vote.
- She was beaten by police on several occasions nearly to death during nonviolent demonstrations.

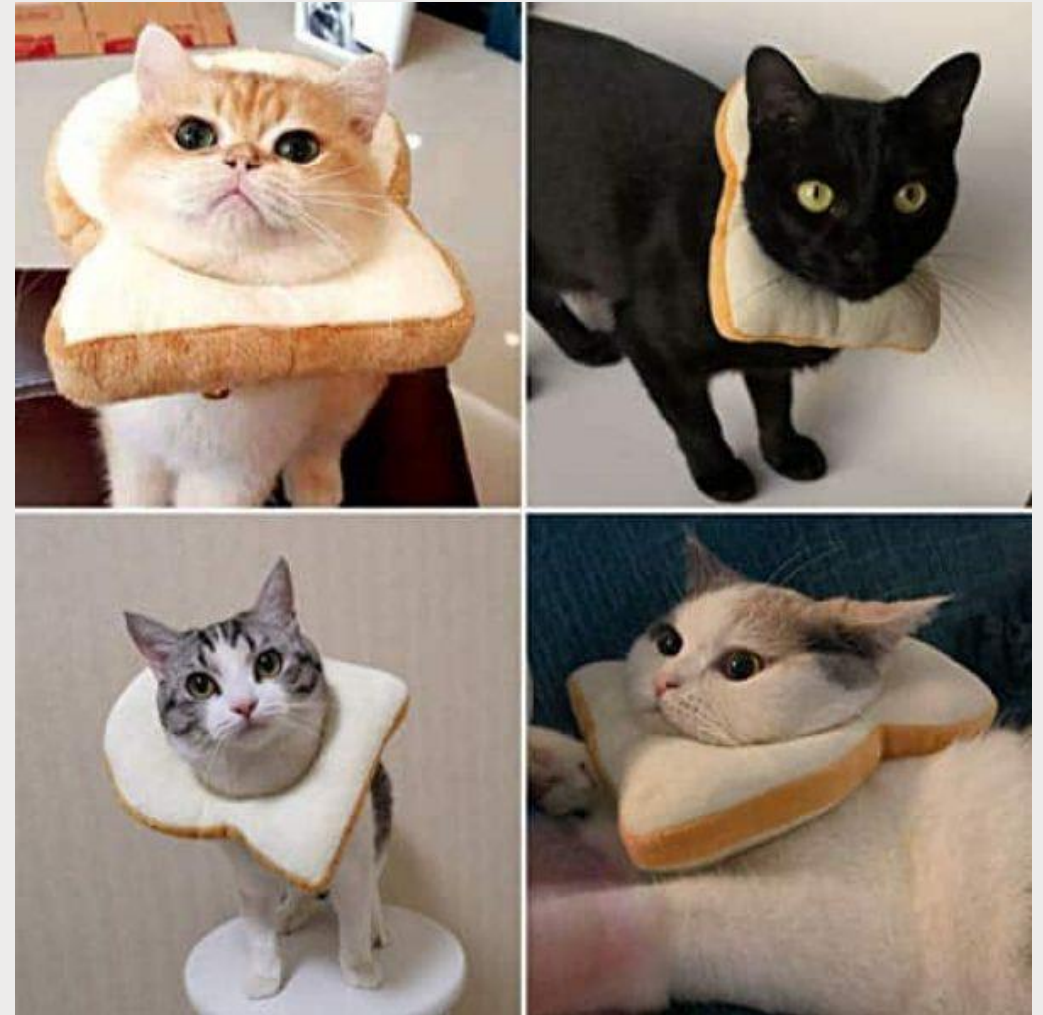

# Juxtaposition

- When two opposing (opposite) things are placed side by side for the sake of comparison.
- Used to emphasize differences as a rhetorical effect.











# Juxtaposition Text Example

- “You will soon be asked to do great **violence** in the cause of **good**.”
- “I am a **rose** who grew through **concrete**.”

# Black History Month Day 5 – Malcolm X

- 1925-1965
- Former member of the Nation of Islam.
- Believed in the unification of African Americans to be economically, politically, and socially independent
- Believed in self-protection against white supremacy “by any means necessary”
